PRAYER OF PREPARATION

**Almighty God, unto whom all hearts be open,
all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid:
cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of thy Holy Spirit,
that we may perfectly love thee, and worthily magnify thy holy name;
through Christ our Lord. Amen.**

The priest enters the sanctuary and addresses the people, saying:

SUMMARY OF THE LAW

(except on the first Sundays of Advent and Lent)

Our Lord Jesus Christ said:
Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God is one Lord;
and thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart,
and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength.
This is the first commandment.
And the second is like, namely this:
Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself.
There is none other commandment greater than these.
On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.
**Lord, have mercy upon us,
and write all these thy laws in our hearts, we beseech thee.**

On the first Sundays of Advent and Lent, The Commandments are read (see page 15 of this booklet).

THE COLLECT FOR THE SOVEREIGN

Almighty God, whose kingdom is everlasting, and power infinite:
Have mercy upon the whole Church;
and so rule the heart of thy chosen servant
Charles our King and Governor,
that he (knowing whose minister he is)
may above all things seek thy honour and glory;
and that we, and all his subjects
(duly considering whose authority he hath)
may faithfully serve, honour, and humbly obey him, in thee,
and for thee, according to thy blessed Word and ordinance;
through Jesus Christ our Lord,
who with thee and the Holy Ghost liveth and reigneth,
ever one God, world without end. Amen.

THE CREED

I believe in one God the Father almighty,

PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION

Brief biddings may be given by way of introduction.

grant, that all they that do confess thy holy name
may agree in the truth of thy holy word,
and live in unity and godly love.

We beseech thee also
to save and defend all Christian kings, princes and governors;
and specially thy servant Charles our King,
that under him we may be godly and quietly governed:
and grant unto his whole Council,
and to all that are put in authority under him,
that they may truly and impartially minister justice,
to the punishment of wickedness and vice,
and to the maintenance of thy true religion and virtue.

Give grace, O heavenly Father, to all bishops, priests and deacons,
that they may both by their life and doctrine
set forth thy true and lively word,
and rightly and duly administer thy holy sacraments:
and to all thy people give thy heavenly grace;
and specially to this congregation here present;
that, with meek heart and due reverence,
they may hear and receive thy holy word;
truly serving thee in holiness and righteousness all the days of their life.

And we most humbly beseech thee of thy goodness, O Lord,
to comfort and succour all them,
who in this transitory life
are in trouble, sorrow, need, sickness, or any other adversity.
And we also bless thy holy name
for all thy servants departed this life in thy faith and fear;
beseeching thee to give us grace so to follow their good examples,
that with them we may be partakers of thy heavenly kingdom.
Grant this, O Father, for Jesus Christ's sake,
our only mediator and advocate. **Amen.**

to the honour and glory of thy name;

ABSOLUTION

The priest says

Almighty God, our heavenly Father,
who of his great mercy
hath promised forgiveness of sins
to all them that with hearty repentance and true faith turn unto him:
have mercy upon you;
pardon and deliver you from all your sins;
confirm and strengthen you in all goodness;
and bring you to everlasting life;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

grant us therefore, gracious Lord,
so to eat the flesh of thy dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his blood,
that our sinful bodies may be made clean by his body,
and our souls washed through his most precious blood,
and that we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us.
Amen.**

THE PRAYER OF CONSECRATION

The priest, standing at the table, says the Prayer of Consecration

Almighty God, our heavenly Father,
who of thy tender mercy didst give thine only Son Jesus Christ to suffer
death upon the cross for our redemption;
who made there (by his one oblation of himself once offered)
a full, perfect and sufficient sacrifice,
oblation and satisfaction for the sins of the whole world;
and did institute,
and in his holy gospel command us to continue,
a perpetual memory of that his precious death,
until his coming again:

Hear us, O merciful Father,
we most humbly beseech thee;
and grant that we
receiving these thy creatures of bread and wine,
according to thy Son
our Saviour Jesus Christ's holy institution,
in remembrance of his death and passion,
may be partakers of his most blessed body and blood:
who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread;
and, when he had given thanks, he brake it,
and gave it to his disciples, saying,
Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you:
do this in remembrance of me.

Likewise after supper he took the cup;
and, when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying,
Drink ye all of this;
for this is my blood of the new testament,
which is shed for you and for many,
for the remission of sins:
do this, as oft as ye shall drink it,
in remembrance of me.

GIVING OF COMMUNION

*Those of any Christian denomination who are accustomed to receiving Holy Communion in their own churches are invited to do so here, as directed by the stewards (please let a steward know if you require a gluten-free wafer). **Please note that we no longer allow intinction (the dipping of the bread into the wine) here at the Cathedral.** The fullness of the sacrament is received in either bread or wine. Those who wish to come forward for a blessing are also most welcome: please bring this service booklet as a sign of your intention.*

The priest and people receive communion.

for ever and ever. Amen.**

The priest says either the Prayer of Oblation or the Prayer of Thanksgiving.

PRAYER OF OBLATION

O Lord and heavenly Father,
we thy humble servants
entirely desire thy fatherly goodness
mercifully to accept
this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving;
most humbly beseeching thee to grant,
that by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ,
and through faith in his blood,
we and all thy whole Church may obtain remission of our sins,
and all other benefits of his passion.

And here we offer and present unto thee, O Lord,
ourselves, our souls and bodies,
to be a reasonable, holy and lively sacrifice unto thee;
humbly beseeching thee,
that all we, who are partakers of this holy communion,
may be fulfilled with thy grace and heavenly benediction.

And although we be unworthy, through our manifold sins,
to offer unto thee any sacrifice,
yet we beseech thee to accept this our bounden duty and service;
not weighing our merits, but pardoning our offences,
through Jesus Christ our Lord;
by whom, and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Ghost,
all honour and glory be unto thee, O Father almighty,
world without end.

Amen.

PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

Almighty and ever-living God,
we most heartily thank thee, for that thou dost vouchsafe to feed us,
who have duly received these holy mysteries,
with the spiritual food of the most precious body and blood
of thy Son our Saviour Jesus Christ;
and dost assure us thereby
of thy favour and goodness towards us;
and that we are very members incorporate
in the mystical body of thy Son,
which is the blessed company of all faithful people;
and are also heirs through hope of thy everlasting kingdom,
by the merits of the most precious death
and passion of thy dear Son.

And we most humbly beseech thee, O heavenly Father,
so to assist us with thy grace,
that we may continue in that holy fellowship,
and do all such good works
as thou hast prepared for us to walk in;
through Jesus Christ our Lord,
to whom, with thee and the Holy Ghost,
be all honour and glory, world without end.

Amen.

GLORIA IN EXCELSIS

is said every Sunday throughout the year.

**Glory be to God on high,
and in earth peace, goodwill towards men.**

**We praise thee, we bless thee,
we worship thee, we glorify thee,

The following is said on the first Sunday of Advent and Lent in place of the Summary of the Law on page 3.

THE COMMANDMENTS

God spake these words and said:

I am the Lord thy God;

thou shalt have none other gods but me.

**Lord, have mercy upon us,
and incline our hearts to keep this law.**

Thou shalt not make to thyself any graven image,
nor the likeness of any thing that is in heaven above,
or in the earth beneath, or in the water under the earth.

Thou shalt not bow down to them, nor worship them:

for I the Lord thy God am a jealous God,

and visit the sins of the fathers upon the children

unto the third and fourth generation of them that hate me,

and shew mercy unto thousands in them that love me

and keep my commandments.

**Lord, have mercy upon us,
and incline our hearts to keep this law.**

Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain:

for the Lord will not hold him guiltless

that taketh his name in vain.

Honour thy father and thy mother;
that thy days may be long in the land
which the Lord thy God giveth thee.

Thou shalt do no murder.

Thou shalt not commit adultery.

**Lord, have mercy upon us,

Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbour.

and incline our hearts to keep this law.**

Thou shalt not covet thy neighbour's house,
thou shalt not covet thy neighbour's wife, nor his servant,
nor his maid, nor his ox, nor his ass, nor anything that is his.

**Lord, have mercy upon us,
and write all these thy laws in our hearts, we beseech thee.**

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
